"Queen of the Canopy" Opens Season of Beloved National Geographic Live Series from Arts Commons Presents

The 2024-25 season of National Geographic Live transports audiences from the depths of old growth forests to inhospitable slopes of active volcanos, to North America's first National Park, and deep below the waves.

October 17, 2024 - CALGARY – This fall, National Geographic Live celebrates its 14th season of taking Calgary into the field with the Explorers of National Geographic. Accompanied by powerful images and high-resolution video, they share cutting edge scientific discoveries, wild encounters, and poignant stories – live in the Jack Singer Concert Hall at Arts Commons. Lauded for her groundbreaking research on canopy ecology, multi-award-winning scientist and National Geographic Explorer Nalini Nadkarni has been nicknamed "Queen of the Canopy." Her innovative approach to preserving the Earth's biodiversity has included convening artists, slam poets, and modern dancers to disseminate their own perceptions of forest canopies to arts audiences nationally. She has integrated her approach into what she terms "tapestry thinking," bringing together seemingly disconnected ways of knowing, and tailoring the qualities of nature through the values of others to amplify the power of nature and the need to protect it.

"The canopy is the heart and lungs of the world," says Nalini Nadkarni. "We don't have to protect things just because they're pretty. We can protect them because they're important."

A contributor to 150 scientific papers and books as well as being featured on TED talks and numerous other appearances, she has cast new insights on the importance of canopy plants in ecosystem processes and the effects of human activities on forest diversity and function. She has also innovated engagement with non-traditional groups, including faith-based groups, corporations, and people who are incarcerated. Her programs guide people in state prisons and youth detention centers to rear endangered species for ecological restoration projects, providing them with direct ways to contribute to preserving Earth's biodiversity even while incarcerated.

"Trees are magical, they see everything, are connected to everything, and they know our history. Nalini has such a powerful and wonder-filled perspective on all the ways that trees contribute to the well-being of our world," says Sarah Garton Stanely, VP of programming at Arts Commons. "And when she brings us to the treetops, it's a look into a world rich with beauty, complexity and surprise!"

National Geographic Live has captured the imaginations of Calgarians, inspiring a love for science and the natural world since its launch in 2012. The series highlights Explorers at the forefront of their fields, traversing the planet with stunning video and photography projected on the high-resolution screen that spans the Jack Singer Concert Hall stage.
